

CORONAVIRUS RESPONSE AND RELIEF SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT (CRRSAA)

REPORTING ON EMERGENCY FINANCIAL AID GRANTS TO STUDENTS

On December 27, 2020, the President signed the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) (P.L. 116-260). This new law gives the U.S. Department of Education (Department) approximately \$22.7 billion to distribute to institutions of higher education in order to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus through the HEERF. The grant programs authorized under section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act and under section 314(a)(1) of the CRRSAA are referred to below as the "(a)(1) programs" and their funds as "(a)(1) funds." **The following information is reported for the period of Q2 4/1/2021 – 6/30/2021.**

- I. This statement shall serve to acknowledge that our institution signed and returned to the US Department of Education the Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. We further attest that our institution has used, and/or intends to use, the funds received under CRRSAA Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- II. The total amount of funds that the institution has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement under CRRSAA [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Student is <u>\$334,190</u>.
- III. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA as of the date of this report is <u>\$98,000</u>.
- IV. The estimated total number of students at our institution eligible to participate in programs under the CRRSAA as of the date of this report is <u>303</u>.
- V. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under the CRRSAA as of the date of this report is <u>81</u>.
- VI. The following is the method used by our institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much each student would receive under CRSSAA:
 - Student must be in active enrollment status on or since April 1, 2021 for at least three (3) weeks.
 - EFC 0 5,846 for those students who have completed a FAFSA.
 - Has need in relation to any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to COVID-19, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or childcare.
 - Does not have to be Pell eligible.
 - Does not have to complete a FAFSA.

- No application to complete.
- At least \$1,200 per student and possible additional equal amount disbursement based on funds availability.
- VII. The follow instructions/directions/guidance will be provided by our institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants:
 - Each eligible student will be contacted by Florida Education Institute's Financial Aid and Accounting Offices staff to inform them on how to receive their (a)(1) grant funds.
 - Students will continue to be directed to the Florida Education Institute website for up-to-date information.
 - Grants will be disbursed to students via check.
 - Each student must sign and acknowledge having received their check.
 - The Business Office Manager and Financial Aid Director shall maintain and track on a spreadsheet which students have received (a)(1) funds checks.
 - The (a)(1) funds may be disbursed in multiple disbursements in an effort to get money out to as many students as possible.
